YOUR DISTRICT ASSIGNMENTS MAY HAVE CHANGED

Based on the 2010 Federal Census results, the boundaries for many districts in Texas have been redrawn. Voters are advised to check their new Voter Registration Certificate to confirm their U.S. Congress District, Texas State Senate District, Texas House District, County Commissioner Precinct, Justice of the Peace Precinct, and School Board District. You can see all of the races and candidates that will appear on the ballot of your specific precinct by going to www.harrisvotes.com or Vote411.org.

VOTING IN TEXAS PRIMARIES

In Texas, only the Democratic and Republican parties conduct primary elections to select party nominees for the General Election in November. Your vote will help select your party's candidates. To vote in the Primary Election, you must select a political party. At the poll, your Voter Registration Certificate will be stamped with the name of the party you select. Through the end of this year, you will be affiliated with that party. If there is a runoff election, you can only vote in the runoff of the party that you selected (voted with) during the May 29 Primary Election. However, in the November 6, 2012 General Election, you may vote for *any* candidate of *any* party. You are not bound to the candidates of any single political party. VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS ELECTION HAVE NOT CHANGED

There are no new voter ID requirements in effect for the May 29th Primary Election. A listing of acceptable form identification can be found in "What do I take to the Poll?" on page 2 of this *Veters Guide*. Should you encounter problem at the pols, remember you can always cast a provisional ballot. For more than 90 years, the League's mission has been to support active and informed citizen participation in government. The League believes that all of us are stakeholders in *Making Democracy Work*.

The League of Women Voters of Houston Education Fund publishes the Voters Guide to help each voter cast an informed vote. Inside you will find information about the voting process, the duties and responsibilities of the offices that are included in this election, and the names and responses of candidates who are seeking to become their party's nominees for General Election next November.

Questionnaires were sent to candidates who are running in contested races in the parties that select their nomines through a primary election process. (Currently this includes only the Democratic and the Republican parties.) Information about candidates who filed to run for office was obtained through the political parties.

The responses provided by candidates are reproduced without editing or verification. Each candidate is personally and solely responsible for the content of

his/her response. Candidates were given a word limit for their responses. R that exceeded the word limit are indicated by slashes (//). Candidates were to avoid reterences to their opponents. Candidates appearing with no photo submit one. Candidates who failed to respond to our questionnaire are indi-with the words. "No response received." We did not solicit responses unopposed candidates, however, to assist voters, we have included the nam these candidates tollowed by "Running Unopposed."

Information about Early Voting and the voting process was provided by the offices of the Harris County Voter Registra rand the Harris County Clerk.
