THINGS VOTERS SHOULD KNOW

YOUR DISTRICT ASSIGNMENTS MAY HAVE CHANGED

Based on the 2010 Federal Census results, the boundaries for many districts in Texas have been redrawn. Voters are advised to check their new Voter Registration Certificate to confirm their U.S. Congress District, Texas State Senate District, Texas House District, County Commissioner Precinct, Justice of the Peace Precinct, and School Board District. You can see all of the races and candidates that will appear on the ballot of your specific precinct by going to www.harrisvotes.com or Vote411.org.

VOTING IN TEXAS PRIMARIES

In Texas, only the Democratic and Republican parties conduct primary elections to select party nominees for the General Election in November. Your vote will help select your party's candidates. To vote in the Primary Election, you must select a political party. At the poll, your Voter Registration Certificate will be stamped with the name of the party you select. Through the end of this year, you will be affiliated with that party. If there is a runoff election, you can only vote in the runoff of the party that you selected (voted with) during the May 29 Primary Election. However, in the November 6, 2012 General Election, you may vote for any candidate of any party. You are not bound to the candidates of any single political party. VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS ELECTION HAVE NOT CHANGED

There are no new voter ID requirements in effect for the May 29th Primary Election. A listing of acceptable forms of identification can be found in "What do I take to the Poll?" on page 2 of this *Voters Guide*. Should you encounter any problem at the polls, remember you can always cast a provisional ballot. ABOUT THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS AND THIS VOTERS GUIDE

The League of Women Voters is a nonpartisan organization. The League of Women Voters and the League of Women Voters Education Fund do not support or oppose any political party or candidate. For more than 90 years, the League's mission has been to support active and informed citizen participation in government. The League believes that all of us are stakeholders in *Making Democracy Work*.

The League of Women Voters of Houston Education Fund publishes the *Voters Guide* to help each voter cast an informed vote. Inside you will find information about the voting process, the duties and responsibilities of the offices that are included in this election, and the names and responses of candidates who are seeking to become their party's nominees for General Election next November.

Questionnaires were sent to candidates who are running in contested races in the parties that select their nominees through a primary election process. (Currently this includes only the Democratic and the Republican parties.) Information about candidates who filed to run for office was obtained through the political parties.

The responses provided by candidates are reproduced without editing or verification. Each candidate is personally and solely responsible for the content of

his/her response. Candidates were given a word limit for their responses. Replies that exceeded the word limit are indicated by slashes (/). Candidates were asked to avoid references to their opponents. Candidates appearing with no photo failed to submit one. Candidates who failed to respond to our questionnaire are indicated with the words, "No response received." We did not solicit responses from unopposed candidates; however, to assist voters, we have included the names of these candidates followed by "Running Unopposed."

Information about Early Voting and the voting process was provided by the offices of the Harris County Voter Registrar and the Harris County Clerk. Except where noted, candidates are listed in the order in which they will appear on the official ballot published by the Harris County Clerk in cooperation with each political party.
